Message from Tony

Dear Friends,

I can still remember one of my first pieces of work when I began training as a Methodist minister. I was asked, with all the other new students, to write an

essay on “The root of my theology.” I was being asked what belief really made me tick; what idea was fundamental to my understanding of God; what was the doctrine that I held most closely to my heart. We then shared what we had written. It probably won’t surprise you to hear that although there were common themes, we all started in different places. I suppose each one of us was being asked not to be too narrow. I was being discouraged from thinking that the only way to God was the way by which I had been led. Rather, we were all different and God had a variety of ways of leading a variety of people into relationships with himself.

All those years ago, I saw the cross and its revelation of how God shares in our experiences, especially our suffering as the root of my theology. That belief remains important to me. However, over the years my understanding has shifted. As it changes I find it helpful to go back to that old question and to ask it of myself again. Recently I have come to see that at the centre of my thinking is “Grace.”

Grace is seen in God’s love, compassion and generosity. But what makes this love, compassion and generosity gracious is that it is given freely. You may love someone in response to something that they have done in the past; or you may be generous to them because you are hoping to get something out of them in the future. That is not grace. God’s gifts are not dependent upon what we have done in the past. There is nothing we can do to make God love us more; there is nothing we can do to make God love us less. Neither is God only giving now in order to

change or adapt us for the future. God gives freely, in the present moment, with no agenda and no strings attached. God’s love, compassion and generosity are a pure gift.

God’s graciousness is also seen in the gift he gives. It says, “God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.” We cannot begin to earn or deserve this gift, it is freely given. Jesus, who is this gift, confirms that his gift of himself is given not for his own benefit but for the well being, the salvation of others. He says, “I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.”

And the they for whom Jesus came is without limits. I believe that God wants the whole creation to receive and be enfolded in grace. When Jesus looked ahead to the cross he said, “I, when I am lifted up from the earth will draw all people to myself.” There are different ways of understanding what Jesus means by “All people.” It could be quite limited, it could mean that Jesus will draw some of all types of people; some Jews and some Gentiles, some rich and some poor, some women and some men. This means that Jesus shows no restrictions, no particular group will be outside of his saving work. However the words could also be understood in a more generous way. It could be “All people” that is everyone will be saved through the cross. It could even be “All things” that is everything; the whole creation will be drawn to Jesus. The words are open to interpretation. The generous way of looking at them would be true to one of our prayers where we say, “Bring us with the whole creation to your heavenly kingdom.”

So the root of my theology at the moment is “Grace”; Grace freely given with boundless extravagance to the whole creation. But that’s just me. What’s the root of your theology? What is the belief that is closest to your heart?

Wednesday Fellowship

Our first meeting in March was on the first day of the month when we welcomed Bob & Janet with their Therapy Dogs, Katy & Cookie. The idea of Therapy Dogs was brought about by a lady in Maidstone back in 1983 and a Charity called Canine Concern was set up in 1987, the work being entirely voluntary. Bob & Janet used to work for them but then decided to go solo last year working at Medway Hospital. Any money which they raise goes to the Children's Ward or to Cancer Support. They take the dogs into the hospital three days a week and are allowed in many areas including A & E, Medical Wards, Waiting Rooms and Clinics and the Childrens Ward. Patients like to walk the dogs in the wards and are often more responsive with them. They are given a little photo of the dogs to keep and children are given rosettes for being brave if they have undergone treatment. It was an interesting afternoon and we all enjoyed making a fuss of the dogs.

As Easter was going to be early this year, our next meeting on March 16th was a time of reflection as we listened to readings and music based around the wonderful story of Jesus' love for us in His death and resurrection.

Following Easter, on the 30th March, Richard Vincent came to speak to us. He is a Local Preacher and a Circuit Steward and worships at Union Street Methodist Church in Maidstone. He is involved in the Mission Team of the Circuit and they are looking for ways we can have an impact on the area around us. Mission is seen as Worship; Teaching ourselves, learning from each other and caring for each other and those outside the church; Evangelism - sharing the Good News with others. To do this we need to know that sin is separation from God and repentance is a change of heart when we turn back to God and recognise our sin. The Good News is that there is a way back to God through His Son, Jesus and a new life of forgiveness and acceptance. This is God's Grace, His love freely given. We become sanctified through the filling of the Holy Spirit.

The next meeting on April 13th brought our dear friend and Minister, Tony Graff who we always look forward to. He chose St Mark's recording of the

death of Jesus and resurrection, looking particularly at the isolation He must have felt when all deserted Him and fled apart from Peter who then denied Him. He highlighted the women who stood by watching with the crowd. They stood as close to Jesus as they could, which is what we need to do as His disciples. The day after the Sabbath they go to the tomb to anoint the body as an act of love, devotion and charity but they wonder what they will do about the stone. They need not have worried because it is rolled away! Inside is the angel who tells them that He is risen and they must go and tell His friends - He hasn't given up on them. The promise for us is that His risen presence will be with us always and it is for us to pass on the Good News about Him. Don't worry or be afraid - Trust.

Alan Thorne came to speak to us on April 27th and he entitled his talk 'Spring Reflections'. It was a lovely time of poems, readings and music all linked to this special time of the year and reminded us just how blessed we are to live in such a beautiful part of God's world. Sadly, we received the news that one of our members, Joyce Pearson, had passed away at the great age of 95. She was a lovely, gentle, Christian lady and will be greatly missed at our meetings but we know that she is in a better place and at rest with her Lord.

On May 11th, Leslie Trott came to share with us. She made a special trip from West Malling Abbey where she was spending a week on a quiet retreat. She shared a time of meditation with us on the hymn 'Be Thou My Vision' with readings and beautiful music. We went home feeling spiritually refreshed and renewed and grateful to Leslie for giving up a bit of her retreat time for us.

Our last meeting in May was on the 25th, which was Iris Donoghue's birthday. Geoff Harris came to speak to us and his theme was about change in our lives. He began by referring to St Luke's Building Project and the exciting changes this will hopefully bring in the future. He talked about the history of the Fire Service and the many changes it has had to go through in order to keep up with the needs of the time. One of the important changes at the moment is that the Fire Service is joining more with the Police Service so that they can work closer together in emergency situations. Geoff said that being a Christian had certainly helped him when dealing with difficult situations when he was a Fireman.

So another three months has come and gone and we have enjoyed fellowship together and hearing some inspiring and interesting talks courtesy of our

wonderful speakers who give their time to us. Russell, Pauline, Betty Gilbert and Iris have celebrated their birthdays and Hilary & Tony have been on a cruise, which they have promised to share with us about in the Autumn. As ever we have missed Pauline & John but are pleased to know that things are steadily improving and hope that, one day, we might see them back with us.

Church Database Details

- I have been assured that the database is secure and Danny Gibson from St Luke's and the circuit database coordinator only will be able to edit St Luke's information. Ministers and circuit staff will be able to view the information. Individuals can decide what information they wish the circuit to hold. The minimum requirement is name, member or adherent and any church posts held. If you agree to this information being passed please let Danny know by the end of June.
- The basic information will be forwarded if you do not reply.

For His Time

The following is from one of the daily readings in Our Daily Bread, which John & I found very helpful and encouraging so thought we would share it with you.

Psalm 31:15 - My times are in your hands.

When South African pastor Andrew Murray was visiting England in 1895, he began to suffer pain from a previous back injury. While he was recuperating, his hostess told him of a woman who was in great trouble and wanted to know if he had any counsel for her. Murray said, "Give her this paper which I have been writing for my own encouragement. It may be that she will find it helpful." This is what Murray wrote:

"In time of trouble say:

- **First** - God brought me here. It is by His will I am in this strait place. In that I will rest.
- **Next** - He will keep me in His love and

give me grace in this trial to behave as His child.

- **Then** - He will make the trial a blessing, teaching me lessons He intends me to learn, and working in me the grace He means me to bestow.
- **Last** - In His good time He can bring me out again - how and when He knows.
- I am here - by God's appointment, in His keeping, under His training, for His time."

We want the instant solution, the quick fix, but some things cannot be disposed of so readily; they can only be accepted. God will keep us in His love. By His grace, we can rest in Him.

Offertory Envelopes and

giftaid it

The offertory envelope system is one simple way of financially supporting St Luke's by encouraging regular weekly giving. The system is simple, a set of fifty-two weekly dated and numbered envelopes are issued. The number identifies the person to whom the envelope has been issued and the dates are for each Sunday, so that if you are unable to attend St Luke's for any reason the offering can be put in the envelope each week and given at the next visit to church. The advantage of church members using this system helps the Treasurer when preparing the budgets and Angie Rastall who administers the Gift Aid Scheme. As the Envelope Secretary my role is to administer, order and supply the envelopes and I am not present when the envelopes are opened or aware of the contents. In 1982, 71 members of St Luke's were using the envelope system, today it is down to 18 members. Gift Aid it! If you are a UK taxpayer, your donation will be worth up to a **quarter more at no extra cost to you**, Gift Aid means that for every-£1 you-give,-St Luke's can claim up to 25p from the Government. Building Project

The Building Project is progressing well and is still scheduled to finish in the first week of July. There was a little hiccup with the new windows not being delivered until Wednesday 25th May but this did not hold up the project and these are now installed.

During April and May we have received a grant of £2,300 from All Churches Trust, £50 donation from Buttons Funeral Undertakers and an anonymous donation of £5,000. We

have to repay a loan of £70,000 so we still need to work hard at our fundraising. We are awaiting results of our applications for grants from several other funds and hopefully we will hear the outcome in the summer.

April 1st 2016

Finally I have got a job in the government. I was appointed a Commissioner for the Civil Service Commission by the State President. I have seen the hand of God lifting me up. It is a position I never dreamt about. I will have to commence on the 1st May so I have a month to go otherwise life has been hard with no source of income. I will be experiencing a different life, probably a better one. Praise the Lord. Dad is better now although he cannot have a long conversation. The church he built, which had the roof blown off by a storm last month, has been fixed. I am doing a major service on the van and will hopefully have it back on the road sometime next month. Otherwise, it is still in very good shape. May I wish you all well and God's blessings always.

April 8th 2016

I am very happy to tell you that Dad's condition is daily improving and he can now afford a smile. Once again I would like to thank you for all your prayers through which I have seen the hand of God lifting me up. Truly God is in control. The job seems very challenging and there is a lot of expectation. I will have to hire civil servants and promote where necessary. Mind you, I have no experience in this profession. I am not afraid though since with God everything is possible. I am being sworn in on Monday (11th).

April 19th 2016

Malawi has witnessed mushrooming of Pentecostal churches probably owned by some 'breakaway and power hungry' church ministers, most of whom want control over money. They go out registering family ministries and preach in public buses and trains. Interestingly, as they finish preaching they ask for money saying that the safety of the trip depends on the travellers' generosity to the man of God or they should make sure that they make the man of God happy for a special blessing. They even say that travellers should understand that the men of God are always praying for safe trips and so the

travellers must feed them since all their time is committed to ensure safe trips. People are being asked to pay for a blessing prayer and the amount of blessing depends on how much one pays. The more you pay the more blessing you get. Now you wonder who is selling these blessings? We are in the last days. Many false teachings.

April 29th 2016

May I thank all the St Luke's brethren for your prayers. The Almighty has given me a job. Much as the unemployment rate keeps soaring, still God, the overall decider, directed the creation of one just for me. He make a way where human senses see no way. All is set come 1st May I am in the office. As a Civil Service Commissioner I am mandated to direct the hiring, promoting and firing of the entire country's civil servants. There is too much work, though, but because of the environment I am rather enjoying it. I am learning a lot each day.

I am well but away from my family. I am staying by myself in Lilongwe, Malawi's capital city while Doris and the boys are in Blantyre over 220 miles away. I have to get settled first, then will bring them over.
